When a child is not reading at grade level, an Individual Reading Improvement Plan (IRIP) will be developed. This plan includes:

- Extra instruction by RTI team
- Updates on reading progress
- A Read-at-home plan that encourages reading and writing outside of the school day

**Extra Support by RTI Team-** these extra supports in a child's reading improvement plan are an addition to what is already happening in the classroom. These supports will occur in RTI small groups during the school day, 3-4 times a week for about 20-25 minutes a day. Students will not miss regular reading instruction.

<u>Updates on reading progress</u>- Updates will be given with your child's report cards. Feel free to contact your child's teacher or Melissa Duffrin for progress at any time. Together we can work towards your child reading at grade level and make a positive impact on his/her future!

**Read-at-home plan**- Attached are some recommended activities that will help your child. These activities coordinate with the interventions your child is receiving at school.
